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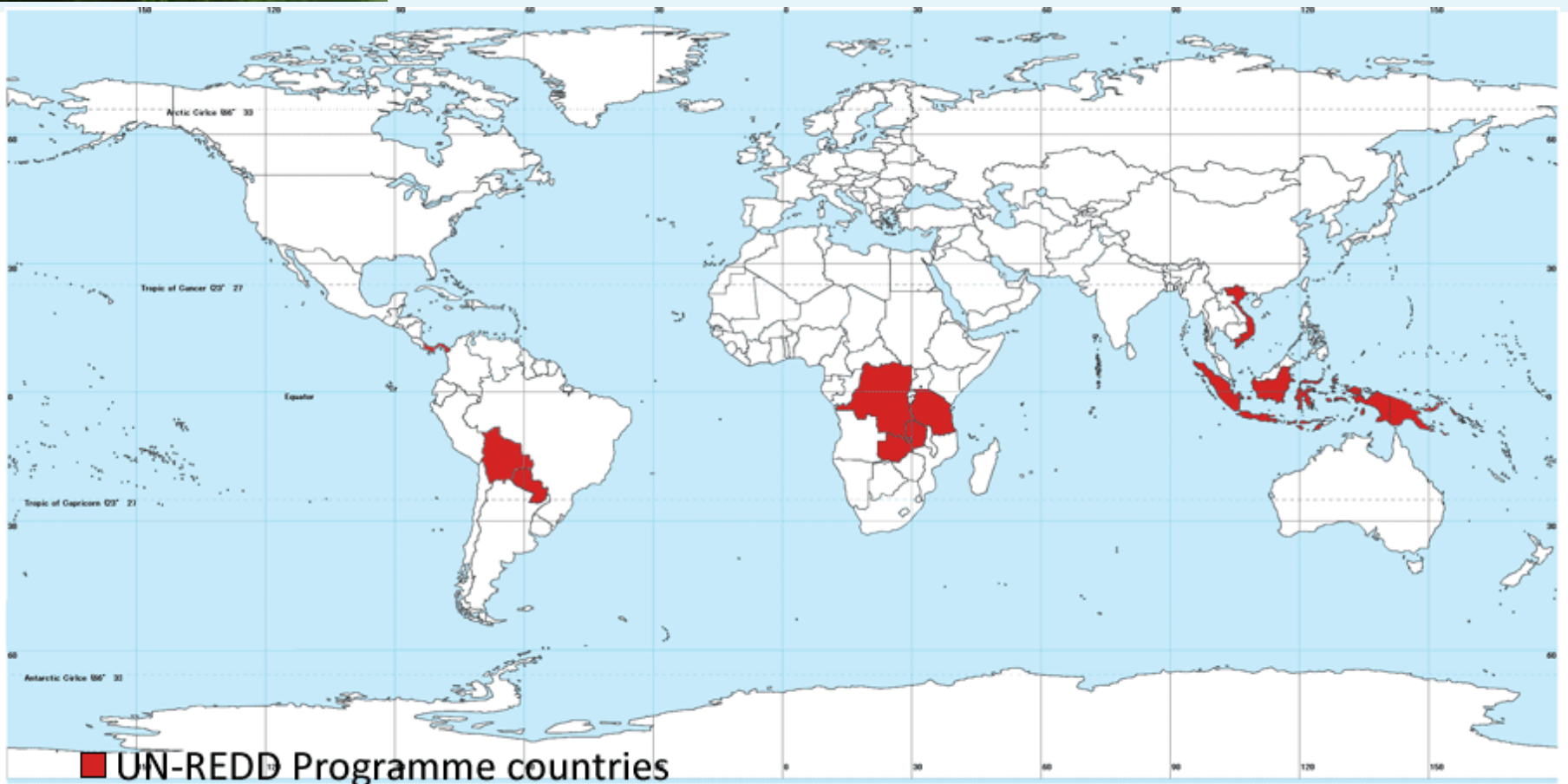

National Programmes





Measuring, Reporting and Verification

- Training and guidelines for national MRV systems – connected to REDD implementation
- Strengthening of remote sensing data supply
- Establishment of new partnerships (e.g capacity development for GHG inventories)
- Clarification of many technical issues: papers on measurement of biomass and forest degradation, and more
- Support to Coalition of Rainforest Nations (CfRFN) CD workshops
- Case studies on carbon assessment: Zambia, Guyana, Suriname



Stakeholder engagement

Engagement of indigenous peoples and civil society organizations (IP/CSO)

- Voting for IP/ CSO representatives on the Policy Board concluded
- Progress in further harmonization of Operational Guidance with FCPF
- Discussions have continued on the application of free and prior informed consent (FPIC)
- IP consultation on the UN-REDD Programme for Asia and the Pacific held in Bangkok in October 2009



Multiple Benefits

- In the process to identify useful tools, analyses or reports on co-benefits, on a national to global scale
- In-country and regional workshops planned



Outreach and knowledge management

- Ensuring presence during big congresses and meetings such as:
 - UNFCCC negotiations (Bonn, Bangkok, Barcelona and Copenhagen)
 - UN Secretary-General's High-Level Event on REDD
 - World Forestry Congress
- Launch of a monthly e-newsletter
- Development of short films and documentaries
- UN-REDD Workspace and website continuously expanded and updated



Secretariat

- Coordinating follow-up actions from 2nd Policy Board meeting
- Supporting 3rd Policy Board meeting
- Coordination of UN Agencies' inputs into the programme planning, monitoring and outreach



Cooperation with the Forest Carbon Partnership Facility and Forest Investment Program

- 28 September: UN-REDD and FCPF/FIP meeting to continue efforts to improve coordination and harmonization
- Key outcomes:
 - Adopt a joint readiness framework
 - Continue to have joint missions
 - Identify common counterpart in countries where both initiatives are present



New UN-REDD Programme strategy

Why?

- Better positioned to support country efforts
- Move to longer-term programming
- Respond to demands by new countries to join UN-REDD
- Respond to changing external environment
